INTRODUCE THE BIBLE STORY

Sometimes it's grandma, sometimes it's even daddy, and sometimes it can be an aunt, an uncle, or a friend who cares for us. There are all kinds of people who can love us and take care of us. In today's story we will hear about a time when Jesus was lost. But first, I have a challenge for you. Somewhere in the room I have hidden a picture of Jesus. Let's see who can find the picture - then meet me back here. [allow preschoolers to search for the pictures of Jesus.]

Who gives us all we need in Jesus? God! Let's listen to where Mary and Joseph found Jesus.

PRACTICE THE KEY PASSAGE

Practice the key verse with preschoolers by adding hand motions. Try grouping preshoolers in a circle and have each one say one word of the verse as you move around the circle.



ARE YOU MY MOTHER?

- Gather interested preschoolers to the story circle. Ask: What does your mother or caregiver do for you to help you? (Let your children respond.)
- Do you think Jesus' mother did the same things for Him? (Let your children respond.)
 Let's take a minute to think about the people who take care of us. Can you think of something special about the person who takes care of you?
- I want to read a story to you about a little bird who had someone very special to take care of him and how he found the special person. If you have already heard the story, be sure not to say anything about how the story ends. I want it to be a surprise for everyone. Read the story, Are You My Mother, by P.D. Eastman.
- We all need someone to take care of us, don't we? Even Jesus needed someone to take care of him. Let's pray and thank God for giving us these special people that take care of us.

CREATE A MOTHER'S DAY GIFT

- At the beginning of class, assemble two to three preschoolers to add their hand print to the
 prepared card stock. Use the paint pens or do-a-dot markers to ink their hands. Have them
 press their hand, palm side down onto the paper. Clean immediately with hand wipes or
 washing their hand at the sink. Add their name to the paper and allow it to dry.
- When the hand print is dry(ish), allow preschoolers to glue the pot over the bottom of their palm print and add flower stickers to the top of the finger tips.
- Today we celebrate the person who takes care of us at home. Who helps you get
 dressed in the morning and makes your favorite breakfast? Who teaches you
 numbers and letters? Who tucks you in at night. My mom made sure I was ready for
 my day by making breakfast for me and I had completed my chores. I'm thankful for
 my mom.
