Except Noah. Noah loved God.

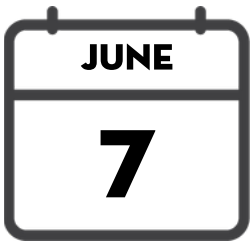

INTRODUCE THE BIBLE STORY

Have preschoolers tidy of the room and then gather in the story area. Place the cards in a stack face down on the floor. Select one preschooler to choose the top card and have them make the noise the animal makes without letting the other preschoolers see the picture. Allow the class to say which animal it is. Move on to the next preschooler to have a turn.
